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WHAT INITATED THIS PROGRAM?

Children with IDD/ASD are at a greater risk of developing comorbid medical conditions, mental health diagnosis and behavioural challenges. In addition, they often experience the following compared to their neurotypical developing peers:

- ✓ Barriers to accessing medically necessary care
- ✓ Delays in diagnosis and treatment
- ✓ More health care encounters & hospitalizations
- ✓ Longer LOS, poorer health outcomes
- ✓ Higher levels of stress and agitation

The ABILITY program launched in 2019 with the goal of providing individualized care through an integrated, adaptive and collaborative approach with a developmental and mental health lens.

All children to receive the right care at the right time...

Adaptive care plans involve planning a patient's hospital visit from home, to hospital, and back home; while thinking of everything in between. The goal is for the patient, family and staff to have a timely, successful hospital encounter.

- Alternate entrance, DSW / Child Life support etc.


ASSESSING ALL CARE NEEDS

- What Helps?
- Self-Injury
- Aggression
- Triggers

- Expressive

MEDICATION

- Sedation plan
- PRN plan

COLLAB & COMMUNICATION

- Interdisciplinary healthcare team
- Community healthcare team
- Documented Plan

CASE EXAMPLE:

16 yo male with IDD/ASD, anxiety and obesity

- Required an urgent dental procedure
- Hx of code white injuring hospital staff & parent
- No medical workup / bloodwork /vaccines in years

Strategies Implemented:


- ✓ Clustered medical care: physical exam, bloodwork, vaccines with dental procedure
- ✓ Customized sedation plan: IM Ketamine administered in vehicle via alternate entrance
- ✓ Visuals created: social story, when-then board, positive reinforcers
- ✓ Team awareness of Code White plan
- ✓ Hospital exit plan via alternate route

IMPACT & NEXT STEPS

	Total	Code White Events
2022	67	0
2023 projected	76	2

- From May-Sep 2023, ~80% of Code White Events involved patients with neurodiversity.
- SickKids is prioritizing supporting increasing hospital wide capacity by:
- ✓ Standardized "My Comfort & Safety Plans"
- ✓ Developmental Service Workers
- ✓ BCBA on Code White team
- ✓ Increased ABILITY team resourcing
